



## CAMPUS PROFILE

# ADMISSION GUIDELINES

Application for admission must be made only on the College Admission Form provided along with the Prospectus. The applicant should attach the following certificates with the admission form:

1. Photocopies of Original Certificates and marksheets of lower examination passed.
2. Five passport sized photographs, a photocopy of Aadhar Card and the e-mail id of the student.
3. Admission to the college is made provisionally at the sole risk and responsibility of the candidate and is subject to the approval of GNDU. If approval to the admission is withheld by the competent authority for any reason, the student shall bear the whole responsibility and will not be

entitled to any claim from the college.

4. If the student has passed previous examination from some other university, then Inter-University migration certificate as well as detail marks certificate must be attached.
5. University Registration card, if already registered with Guru Nanak Dev University must be attached.
6. The Principal reserves the right to grant or refuse admission without assigning any reason.
7. SC/ST/BC/ students must attach certificates from competent authorities .
8. Supporting certificates and testimonials to be submitted by outstanding sports personals.

## Payment of College Dues

## Code of Conduct

#### **Eligibility for Fee Concessions :**

- Fee concession will be permissible on the amount of odd semester fee in the particular course excluding the Examination, Verification, Migration, Enrollment, Registration, Eligibility Fee or other special Fee charged by the university.
- There will be an additional fee for the practical subjects.
- Concession, Stipends and Scholarship of all Categories are liable to be withdrawn if a student fails to clear all papers in mid semester test and final exams, remains irregular in attendance or is found guilty of misbehavior inside or outside the college.
- In case a student migrates or leaves the college in the mid-session, she will be required to pay back the amount of concession.

- The student shall be promoted to Sixth semester, only, if she has passed all the papers of the first semester. After a period of six semesters, the student shall be given a period of two consecutive years to pass.
